

Nineteenth Annual Report of the Indian Phytopathological Society for the year 1965

Mr. President, members of the I.P.S., Ladies and Gentlemen,

I am presenting herewith the 19th Annual Report of the Society for the year 1965. Sixty two new members joined the Society, 3 as life-members and 59 as ordinary members. Twenty two members discontinued due to non payment of the subscriptions during the year. It is a matter of great regret that Dr. R. P. Asthana, a distinguished member of the Society expired during the period under report. The total number of the members at the end of the year was 405 and that of subscribers 268. Subscription is due from a few members only.

During the year, volumes XVII, No. 4, 1964 and XVIII, Nos. 1-3, 1965 of Indian Phytopathology have been issued. The financial position of the Society continued to be satisfactory. Besides, a sum of Rs. 7,500/- continues to remain in the form of N. S. certificates. The amount to the credit of the Society in the S. B. Account with M/s. National and Grindlays Bank Ltd. (Lloyds Branch), New Delhi. and cash in hand taken together on 30-11-65 was Rs. 22,538.58 p. Thus the assests of the Society amount to Rs. 30,038.58. In addition, several cheques are in the process of collection.

During the year the receipts amount to Rs. 19,586.63 and expenditure to Rs. 12,898.95, thus showing a balance of Rs. 6,687.68. It may be mentioned that no financial assistance was received by the Society from any source during the year. We have paid the cost of printing Vol. XVII, Nos. 3 and 4, 1964 and also of Vol. XVIII, Nos. 1 and 2, 1965. The printing of the journal has been in the hands of M/s. Kapoor Art Press, New Delhi.

Five Council meetings were held during the year.

I am glad to inform you that, 11 more members in India have expressed their desire to become fellows of the Society. They will be introduced in the morning session on 2nd January, 1966.

The following resolutions were considered by the General body and passed :

1. Resolved that the membership fee be increased to Rs. 20.00 per year and the rate for subscriptions (Institutions etc.) to Rs. 40.00 per year from January, 1966 in view of increased cost of printing of the Journal.
2. Resolved that the existing rule restricting new life membership to 5 per year be removed and any member may be admitted for life membership by paying Rs. 240.00 either in lump sum or in 12 instalments within a year.
3. Resolved that eminent Plant Pathologists of the country who get elected to the office of Presidentship of the Society but have not put in 10 years' continuous membership may be exempted from this rule and be accepted as eligible for the Fellowship of the Indian Phytopathological Society provided the registration fee of Rs. 20/- is paid.
