## Report of the Secretary presented at the 55th General Body Meeting of the Indian Phytopathological Society held at Osmania University, Hyderabad January 16-18, 2003

Mr. President, Members of Indian Phytopathological Society, Ladies and Gentlemen, it is my proud priviledge to welcome you all in this 55th Annual General Body Meeting of the Society at Osmania University Campus, Hyderabad. It gives me great pleasure to present before you the report of various activities of the Society held during 2002.

On the outset I would like to inform this august house that nine Life Members of our Society passed away to their heavenly abode during this year namely Drs. Amar Singh (IARI, New Delhi), R.D, Khulbe (Nainital), K.D. Paharia (Lucknow), Prof. A. Mahadevan (Chennai)), Paritosh Nandi (Kolkata), Arun Chitriv (Nagpur), Sunil Desai (Dharwad), M.N. Singh (Shimla) and H.C. Govindu (Bangalore). The members of the Society express their sincere condolences and profound grief to the bereaved families and pray to almighty that their souls may rest in peace.

At present the total number of members of the Society as on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2002 stands at 1600 including 200 newly enrolled members and 200 subscribers.

The 55th Presidential Address on "Biodiversity, taxonomy, ecology, conservation and biotechnology of arbuscular micorrhizal fungi" was delivered by Prof. C. Manoharachary, President-IPS and the lecture was chaired by Prof. K.G. Mukherjee. The Society is extremely grateful to Dr. A.K. Roy for delivering Jeersanidhi Lecture Award.

Mundkur Memorial Lecture to be presented by Dr. V. Raghunathan (Faridabad) could not be delivered.

All the seven Zonal Chapters of the Society remained very active and organized symposia in their respective Zonal Meetings on important aspects of plant diseases. I congratulate Zonal Presidents and Councillors for their sincere efforts and activities.

Society published 138 manuscripts in *Indian Phytopathology* Vol. **55 (2002)**. The font of the journal has been changed to **Arial type w.e.f. Vol. 55 (2002)**, which has been appreciated by majority of the members. The credit goes to our Chief Editor, Prof. P. Bahadur and Editor, Dr. RK. Jain for their painstaking efforts.

In this National Symposium on "Plant Pathogens Diversity in Relation to Plant Health" 273 papers have been received for presentation. Many invited speakers also presented their views on the theme of symposium. Out of which 121 poster papers were presented.

The Society has been able to generate an "Endowment Fund" of Rs. 48,000.00 received as contribution from Dr. G.S. Shekhawat, Former Director, CPRI, Shimla and our Ex President of the Society. The interest accrued out of this fund will be utilized solely for the purpose of enhancement of Mundkur Memorial Award Lecture money.

The Poster Evaluation Committee recommended the poster paper presented by Dr. S.A.M.H. Naqvi on "Production of Phytophthora free nursery stocks –mandatory to avert decline and death of citrus plants in India" for Prof. K.P.V. Menon Best Poster Paper Award.

Twelve young scientists nominated by Zonal Chapters participated in Prof. M.J. Narasimhan Merit Academic Award Contest this time. The Judging Committee has recommended the paper presented by N. Kulkarni, P. Lavakumar, V. Muniyappa and D.V.R. Reddy entitled "Studies on pigeonpea sterility mosaic disease: transmission virus vector relationships and

identification of resistant sources" from UAS, GKVK, Bangalore for this Award. Our heartiest congratulations to him.

Several recommendations made by the Executive Council Meeting have been approved by the General Body.

## Journal

- Enhancement of Student Annual Membership fee at par with regular members @ Rs. 350.00 w.e.f. January 2003.
- Enhancement of Life Membership fee from 2500.00 to 3500.00 w.e.f. January 2003.
- Enhancement of subscriber fee from Rs. 1200 to Rs. 1500.00 w.e.f. January 2003.
- Provision for office space at NASC Complex:-It was decided that Secretary and President should discuss the matter with Director, IARI, New Delhi.
- The GB recommended that the backlog of papers pending with the journal should be reduced to 6 months instead of 2 years and a research paper received should be published within 6 months.

Detailed discussions were held on the agenda items of the E.C. Meeting and following decisions were taken.

  - c) The GB agreed to provide partial financial support restricted to Rs. 30000.00 each by Indian Phytopathological Society to attend ICPP Conference as per terms and conditions of the GB meeting held at Lucknow in 1997 to the following persons

Agarwal has been adjudged as Best Research Paper. The second best paper entitled "Monitoring for Metalaxyl resistance in populations of Phytophthora infestans and characteristics in Punjab" by T.S. Thind, Lakhvir Singh, C. Mohan and Joginder Paul Vol. 54 (1): 91-97 (2001) has been recommended for Commendation Certificate.
