Chief Editor's Report (2013)

The report was presented by the Secretary, IPS. During 2013, total 178 papers were received through on-line submissions. Out of these, 59 were rejected, 90 published, 4 are in review, 10 have been accepted for next issue and 15 have been sent back to authors for revision. This shows approximately 33% articles were declined for publication and at present we do not have any backlog.

Brain storming Session on "Plant Disease Clinic: Importance and Scope"

A brain storming Session on "Plant Disease Clinic: Importance and Scope" was held on May 28, 2014 during this national Symposium at IGKV, Raipur to develop the policy for Plant pathologists to be registered as plant doctor. The session was chaired by Dr. U.S. Singh, M. Anandaraj and Dr. D.V. Singh and coordinated by Secretary-IPS, Dr. Pratibha Sharma. Total 62 delegates participated out of which 20 have expressed their views in the session. The proceedings of the same will be compiled and submitted to DG, ICAR for further development.

The following decision were taken and approved by the General body.

- i. It was decided to give an award to the best zone. Guidelines for nomination of IPS awards for best zone will be developed in due course.
- ii. GB agreed on proposal for paid copy editor for editing the manuscripts by professional language editors. The charges should be borne by the authors.
- iii. The number of FPSI every year will 1% of total number of Life members.

iv. Creation of new zone i.e. North-East Zone: The GB agreed on the creation of new North-East Zone to boost up their active participation in the IPS activities in North East states. The following 8 states will be in the North-East Zone: Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizorum, Nagaland, Sikkim and Tripura. However, the Eastern Zone will cover the following 5 states namely, Andaman & Nicobar Island, Bihar, Jharkhand, Orissa and West Bengal.

The Secretary thanked and expressed sincere gratitude to Dr. U.S. Singh, President (2013) and Dr. M. Anandaraj (2014) for their guidance, advice, encouragement and support in day to day functioning of the Society. The secretary also thanked very profusely Prof. S.K.
