Proceedings of 71st Annual General Body Meeting of the Society held at BHU, Varanasi, U.P. on February 27, 2019

It is indeed my proud privilege to welcome all the members of the Society, who have shown their keen interest in the affairs of the Society to come over to attend 71st Annual meeting at BHU, Varanasi, Uttar Pradesh. I thank you all for supporting me to run the Society smoothly.

Meetings held during the year 2018-19

1. Mid-term Executive Council Meeting: April 21, 2018

The proceedings of the meeting has already been shared with all our members and available on IPS website. However, I am going to brief about the action taken on the decisions made in the Mid-term EC Meeting

ACTION TAKEN REPORT of the Mid-term EC meeting

The Society invited agendas from Advisory Board members and Executive Council members for betterment and its smooth functioning. The following agenda were received and decisions were taken as follows:

1. To develop teams of young researchers that can offer webinars on selected topics, which will be very helpful to younger researchers to develop new skills that could be applied in their own research.

Action Taken: Not yet taken

2. To offer workshops on effective scientific writing. This could be spearheaded by the editorial board of the Indian Phytopathology and to develop criteria for effective communication of research. This will be done at zonal level as well as national level.

Action Taken: Not yet taken

3. There must be some proportion of applied field work in our prestigious journal *Indian Phytopathology* to duly recognize the joint contribution of extension plant pathologists/entomologists which may benefit the young budding plant pathologists/entomologists dedicated to work on farmers' field and making farmers aware of the latest plant protection technology.

Action Taken: EC did agree on the proposal

4. A separate meeting of the Delhi based Editorial Board members was held to discuss the review process invited/contributed review articles, book review and maintaining timeliness of the journal.

Action Taken: Proceedings shared among the Editorial Board members and available on IPS website.

5. Two lectures in each zone can be arranged and for this the Society will provide Rs. 5,000.00 per lecture towards refreshment expenditures. The Zonal chapter will have to provide the report of the lecture and photographs with IPS banner and after that the money will be released.

Action Taken: Implemented by the Society, but till date no one has approached for the same.

6. EC agreed on the publication of an edited book on the conference theme and its release at the MEZ meeting.

Action Taken: Book published in two volumes - Bio-intensive Approaches, Application and Effectiveness in Plant Protection. The first volume was released during the Mid-Eastern Zone symposium held at AMU, Aligarh on 29 October 2018 and second volume was released in the International Conference at Bangkok, Thailand on 21 November 2018.

7. Regarding special discount of group membership, EC agreed on special discount of 25% on group membership for group of minimum 20 members and this offer will valid till **31**st **March 2019.**

Action Taken: The Society has received a huge response due to discounted membership rates and this year, January to till date total 560 members (Life 285+ Annual 275) have been enrolled in the Society this year.

8. CSR (Company Society Responsibility) Project

Action taken: Agreement has been signed with **FIINOVATION** and the project of budget **Rs. 1.0 Crore** was been submitted.

Present status: This is inform you that the donor agency is almost done with the MIS formats however, the donor wants to be sure on the following points:-

- a) Quarterly financial utilization report and its format.
- b) The utilization report should constitute of utilization done in the previous quarter, discrepancy found, if any
- c) Maximum of 5% reallocation across the line items without approval from the donor to be allowed.

The Society agreed on the above points.

(iv) Initiation of IPS Newsletter for better interaction among the members.

It was discussed and agreed by the EC for **IPS Newsletter** to introduce with the help of all 8 Zonal Presidents and Zonal Councillors.

Action taken: The Society has initiated to publish quarterly online newsletter "Indian Phytopath News" from 2018 and I am glad to inform you that all the 4 issues of the Newsletter published timely and are available online on IPS website in pdf form.

2. Editorial Board Meeting held on April 21, 2018

Meeting of the Delhi based editorial board members with Chief Editor was held on April 21, 2018 in the IPS office, Division of Plant Pathology, IARI, New Delhi.

The following members were present:

Dr. M. Anandaraj, Chief Editor; Dr. V.K. Baranwal, Sr. Editor; Dr. R.N. Pandey, President-IPS; Dr. M.P. Thakur, President Elect -IPS; Dr. Dinesh Singh, Secretary; Dr. M.S. Saharan and Dr. T.K. Bag, Editors of the journal Indian Phytopathology. However, other members could not be present due to their preoccupied schedule.

The following agenda were discussed:

i. Book reviews by IPS fellows- evolving guidelines/ modifying the present guidelines

As per the norms of the society, the author may send two copies of the book to be
reviewed to IPS office. One copy would be sent to a reviewer and another retained in
the library of IPS.

ii. Review process of Invited review articles and Review articles sent by contributors.

The review process of the invited review articles will be same as research article review process. The review article will be sent to two reviewers for their comments and on the basis of comments the decision will be taken for its publications.

However, the award lecture articles in the form of "Invited Review" will be published after thorough editing by the senior/chief editor.

iii. Maintaining timeliness of Journal

It was discussed that some of the editors, who even after many reminders does not respond for getting the MS review done. It was proposed to replace them with the new prominent editors. However, members suggested to withdraw the article after due date and write a letter in polite way to complete their assignment in future or to talk them in person to do the same.

iv. One special issue every year

It was discussed that one special issue will be published every year on a specific topic. This year it has been proposed to publish fourth issue (October – December, 2018) as

special issue on "Advances in Fusarium Research". Total 54 manuscripts received for special issue out of which 8 accepted, 22 rejected and 24 are in process.
