

- Innovative strategies for post-harvest disease management. (*Bio-priming, natural extracts, essential oil, edible coating, etc.*)
- Recent advances in extension-plant pathology and entrepreneurship. (AI, ICT tools, advisory services, entrepreneurial roles, etc.)
- Policy support and local-global collaborations. (*Policy, education, marketing, plant health awareness and regulations*)







ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

The Central Agricultural University (CAU) was established under the Department of Agricultural Research and Education (DARE) on 26th January 1993 by the Central Agricultural University Act, 1992 (No.40 of 1992) of parliament, with its headquarters at Imphal, Manipur. It is a fully residential university covering all the North-East Hill states under its jurisdiction except Assam. Like other Agricultural Universities in India, the CAU also has integrated teaching, research and extension education programs. As per the mandate, the university has established 13 constituent colleges, *viz*; i) College of Agriculture (Pasighat, Arunachal Pradesh), ii) College of Horticulture & Forestry (Pasighat, Arunachal Pradesh), iii) College of Agriculture (Imphal, Manipur), iv) College of Fisheries (Agartala, Tripura), v) College of Home Science (Tura, Meghalaya), vi) College of Veterinary Sciences & Animal Husbandry (Aizawl,

Mizoram), vii) College of Veterinary Sciences & Animal Husbandry (Jaluki, Nagaland), viii) College of Agricultural Engineering & Post-Harvest Technology (Gangtok, Sikkim), ix) College of Food Technology (Imphal, Manipur), x) College of Post Graduate Studies in Agricultural Sciences (Umiam, Meghalaya), xi) College of Horticulture (Bermiok, Sikkim), xii) College of Horticulture (Thenzawl, Mizoram) and xiii) College of Agriculture, (Kyrdemkulai, Meghalaya). University also has 6 Krishi Vigyan Kendra (KVKs) and 6 Multi Technology Testing Center & Vocational Training Center (MTTC & VTCs).

ABOUT THE COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE, PASIGHAT

The College was established on 26th November 2013 at Pasighat, Arunachal Pradesh on the bank of beautiful river Siang to serve as a leading centre of education, research, extension and training in the field of agriculture and allied subjects in the state. The state lies in Eastern Himalayan zone of India and has four agro-climatic zones. Because of its varied agro-climatic zones, the soil and climatic condition of the state offers an ideal condition for the production of a wide variety of field crops and horticultural crops. It is situated at 28.06' N latitude and 95.32' E longitudes at an elevation of 157 msl. Murkongselek, Dibrugarh and Harmuti are the nearest railway stations located 37 km, 151 km and 224 km respectively, away from the Pasighat. It is well connected to Murkongselek, Dibrugarh, Itanagar, Guwahati, Kolkata and New Delhi by train. It is also connected with Dibrugarh, Itanagar, Guwahati, Kolkata and New Delhi by flight. Weather of Pasighat in the month of November is expected to be cooling pleasant with mean maximum temperature of 27°C and mean minimum temperature of 20°C. Afternoon is pleasant and nights are cold.

On the hill slopes, they mostly engage in a custom that is deeply ingrained in their history and tradition: "shifting cultivation" or "Jhum". Arunachal Pradesh is not only geographically strategic but also spiritually vital in the Buddhist world, especially among Himalayan and Tibetan Buddhist communities. Would you like to explore the history of Tawang Monastery deeper or know about the festivals celebrated there? The Kalika Purana and the renowned Hindu epic Mahabharata both make reference to Arunachal Pradesh. It is thought to be the Puranas' Prabhu Mountains. In Arunachal Pradesh, the sage Parshuram washed away his sin, the sage Vyasa pondered, King Bhishmaka established his kingdom, and Lord Krishna wed his wife Rukmini, according to a Hindu legendary account. Numerous historical structures and archeological remnants can be found throughout Arunachal Pradesh, India, which has been the site of numerous strong dynasties and kingdoms. 
ACCOMMODATION


